



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# **Prequalification Milestones**

#### **DB Team (Contractor/Architect)**

- Prequal Package Available July 14, 2020
- Mandatory Meeting July 28, 2020
- Prequal Submittal August 5, 2020
- Evaluation Completed September 2020
- DB Team Interviews September 2020



### **Prequalification**

#### **Step 1 - Points**

Points will be assigned based on relevance of projects submitted against the RFQ Criteria

#### **Step 2 - Interview**

University may interview approximately 4-5 teams, selecting 3 to proceed into the competition

The Design Build teams that receive 130 or more points out of a possible 180 points based on the established rating system will be invited to participate in the Level II Interview step and be evaluated by the University's evaluation committee.



# **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Rating & Evaluation Procedures**

#### **Design-Builder (General Contractor) must have:**

- General Building "B" License
- Financial capability confirmed by Surety
- Ability to obtain required insurance
- EMR less than or equal to 1.15
- Relevant project experience
- Adequate key personnel experience



# **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Rating & Evaluation Procedures**

#### **Design-Builder (General Contractor) must not have:**

- Prior Disqualification by a Public Agency
- Adverse claims history
- Termination for Cause by an Owner in the past 5 years
- EMR Greater than 1.15 in the past 5 years



# **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Rating & Evaluation Procedures**

#### Points will be assigned through the evaluation of:

Part A: Relevant project experience

Key personnel experience

Part B: Project Similarity to SHCC

Design Build Delivery

Owner References (for teams interviewed)

A PROSPECTIVE DESIGN-BUILD TEAM MAY BE FOUND NOT PRE-QUALIFIED IF THE UNIVERSITY RECEIVES POOR PERFORMANCE REFERENCES ON OTHER PROJECTS.



### **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Design-Builder (General Contractor) & Design Firm Experience**

- The Contractor & Architect must have successfully completed at least (1) one multi-story project, not necessarily together (more are recommended).
- The Contractor & Architect must have successfully completed at least (2) two health care-related projects each, not necessarily together (more are recommended)
- The Contractor & Architect must have successfully completed at least (1) one public works project, not necessarily together (more are recommended)
- Each project must be **LEED Silver** or better
- Each project with construction award value of at least \$20,000,000
- The Contractor & Architect must have successfully completed at least one project (more are recommended) since 2010 that was design/build delivery, i.e. where the architect for that project was a sub-consultant to the Contractor or a joint venture with the Contractor (negotiated or construction management does not meet this requirement).



# **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Design-Builder (General Contractor) & Design Firm Experience**

- Projects submitted to demonstrate experience between contractor and architect on same team does not need to be healthcare related but is preferred.
- Each project must be **30,000 g.s.f.** each or greater
- Projects completed prior to 2010 will not be considered
- Residential projects will not be considered
- Incomplete projects will not be considered



# **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Additional Requirements**

Each submitted project must be accompanied by photograph(s) of the completed project.

Submit a list of all Multi-Story and Health Care-related projects completed in the past 10 years for institutions of higher learning for private or public agencies that include some or all of the criteria listed previously. Include the following:

- **Project Name**
- Project Owner include contact name, title, phone number & email address
- **Final Contract Amount**
- **Completion Date**

#### **Key Personnel Experience**

#### **Design Builder (Contractor)**

- Project Executive
- Design Builder's Design Manager (Preconstruction)
- Design Builder's Project Manager (may be the same as Design Manager)
- Design Builder's Construction Superintendent

- Principal Architect
- Project Architect/Project Manager



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# **Proposal (RFP) & Award Process**

#### **Two-part Proposal Submittal: Technical Proposal + Cost Proposal**

#### **Technical Proposal**

A technical evaluation committee comprised of PD&C, stakeholders, a member from the
programming architect, structural engineer and a General Contractor will evaluate
proposals. Each committee member individually evaluates and assigns technical points to
each proposal using evaluation criteria provided in the Technical Proposal document.

#### **Cost Proposal**

- Best value score is calculated by dividing the total proposed cost by the average of the technical points assigned by the evaluation committee.
- The proposer that achieves the lowest cost per technical point will be selected as the apparent best value proposer.
- Stipend: \$150,000 (per firm)



# **Proposal (RFP) & Award Process**

#### Provisional Maximum Acceptable Contract Amount (MAC)

- Provisional MAC: \$26,000,000 \$27,000,000
- What the MAC means to UCR The entire DB Contract Amount
- MAC Composition: Total construction cost + All design and consultant fees
- Cost proposal greater than MAC is non-responsive

<sup>\*</sup> MAC will be stated formally in the RFP



# **Proposal (RFP) & Award Process**

#### **Features of A Successful RFP Process**

- Maintain schedule
- Develop a best value strategy
- Use 1-on-1 meetings effectively
- Understand the ratio of dollars to points
- Submit a responsive proposal
- Avoid BAFO



# **Proposal (RFP) & Award Process**

#### **Required Proposal Attachments**

- Notarized Statement from Surety
- One (1) copy of all Audited Financial Statements
- Written declaration from insurance agent/broker/carrier stating that your firm can obtain insurance coverage in the required limits and ratings
- Certificate of Insurance
- Letter from Workers' Compensation carrier evidencing your EMR for the past (5) Five years
- Resumes of all proposed Key Personnel
- Signatures on Forms A, B, and C declaring the answers are true and correct, as applicable

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# **Requirements for Prequalification**

#### **Public Works Compliance**

No contractor or subcontractor may be listed on a Bid for this project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5 [with limited exceptions from this requirement for bid purposes only under Labor Code section 1771.1(a)].

No contractor or subcontractor may be awarded any portion of this project unless registered with the Department of Industrial Relations pursuant to Labor Code section 1725.5.

This project is subject to compliance monitoring and enforcement by the Department of Industrial Relations.

This project is subject to General Prevailing Wages predetermined by the Department of Industrial Relations (DIR).
